Kids: We Need YOUR Help on Palm Sunday!

This year, Fr. David would like to involve our youth in a special way during the Divine Liturgy on Palm Sunday. All children are invited to carry and wave palms during the Little Entrance of the Divine Liturgy (when the Gospel is carried in procession). PARENTS, all you need to do is a) make sure your children are there at the beginning of Liturgy and b) have them sit in the front pew on the LEFT side of the church. Palms will be provided!

As We Enter the Last Two Weeks of the Great Fast...

Stay strong! Let us all continue our spiritual preparation for Holy Week and Pascha: fast, pray, attend additional services, give charitably, and go to Confession. Use this time to grow closer to Our Lord.

• **HOLY CONFESSION** is available at the following times during Lent:

Sundays from 8:20-8:50 AM Wednesdays from 5:10-5:40 PM Fridays (when service is scheduled) from 5:20-5:50 PM

Use these times, OR make an appointment. If you would like to schedule an appointment for Confession at a time other than those listed, please call/text/e-mail Fr. David (724-813-3172, father.david@stjohnacroc.org).

Confessions will also be heard before the services on Holy Monday, Holy Tuesday, and Holy Wednesday. Confessions will NOT be heard on Holy Thursday, Holy Friday, Holy Saturday or on Pascha Sunday, so plan accordingly. All Orthodox Christians are expected to go to Confession during Lent.

Reminder About the Eucharistic Fast

Those receiving Communion at an evening Liturgy are to fast for a minimum of 3 hours prior to the service. (*Ideally, we should not eat after lunch.*) Fasting from midnight is still observed before receiving Communion at any morning Liturgy. Remember: medications and any food/drink associated with them should be taken as usual, per doctor's orders. (Also, only services titled "Liturgy" have the distribution of Holy Communion. Other services offered during Lent—Vespers, Canons, Molebens, Akathists, Paraklis, Parastas—do not have Communion.)

This will take place on Lazarus Saturday, April 27, after Divine Liturgy. We will have some light refreshments available before we get to work.

Sacramental and Membership Information

Sick Calls can be made at any time. Please phone the rectory (724-346-4457) when a family member is admitted to the hospital, or to request a home visit. Hospitals do *not* call to alert the parish when someone is admitted.

Marriages are solemnized on Saturdays or Sundays. Circumstances may require a dispensation from the diocesan bishop. Consult the pastor at least six months in advance and before any plans have been made for the wedding reception. Marriages cannot be celebrated during the fasting seasons of the church, or on Fridays.

Baptisms are usually scheduled on Saturdays or Sundays. Consult the pastor. Two godparents (godfather and godmother) are required, at least one of whom must be a practicing Orthodox Christian in good standing at an Orthodox parish, and the other (at least) a practicing, baptized Christian.

Church Funerals are, under ordinary circumstances, provided for practicing Orthodox Christians who are current in their spiritual and material obligations to the parish; otherwise, the funeral service is conducted at the funeral home. The Church does not permit cremation.

Parishioners in "good standing" are those Orthodox Christians who, as members of Saint John's Orthodox Church, strive to live according to the teachings of the Orthodox Church; participate in the life of the parish through regular church attendance, regular reception of Holy Communion and periodic Holy Confession (and receive these sacraments no less than once a year); if married, having been married in the Orthodox Church; and financially support the parish (especially through an annual "pledge").

Prospective members and returning members are asked to fill out an application form, copies of which are available in the church office.
