-Pentecost Services

Pentecost is the fiftieth day after Pascha and the feast of the descent of the Holy Spirit. It is the second most important holyday on the Church's calendar – yes, it is even more important than Christmas! We have a number of services in preparation for and in celebration of this holyday, including an All Souls Parastas (Memorial Service), Vespers, and Divine Liturgies on Pentecost Sunday and Pentecost Monday. -Wear GREEN on Pentecost Sunday, June 23rd!

Since the Holy Spirit is called the "Giver of Life," it is a very old Slavic custom to decorate the church for Pentecost with greenery, and for the vestments and altar covers to be green as well. **YOU are welcome to join in, too!** Consider wearing something green to church on Sunday, June 23rd. This is a great way to get into the spirit of the day's liturgical celebration.

- Celebrate Our Patron Saint on Monday, June 24th

June 24th is the day when the Orthodox Church remembers the Nativity of St. John the Baptist. This year, it is also Pentecost Monday – the day of the Holy Spirit. Plan to join us for **Divine Liturgy on Monday**, **June 24th** at 9:00 AM. Following Liturgy, we will hold the traditional Festal Procession with Gospel readings around the church (*outdoors, weather permitting*). *Holy Prophet, Forerunner and Baptist John, pray to God for us*!

 346-4457) when a family member is admitted to the hospital, or to request a home visit. Hospitals do not call to alert the parish when someone is admitted. Marriages are solemnized on Saturdays or Sundays. Circumstances may require a dispensation from the diocesan bishop. Consult the pastor at least six months in advance and before any plans have been made for the wedding reception. Marriages cannot be celebrated during the fasting seasons of the church, or on Fridays. Baptisms are usually scheduled on Saturdays or Sundays. Consult the pastor. Two godparents (godfather and godmother) are required, at least one of whom must be a practicing Orthodox Christian in good standing at an Orthodox parish, and the other (at least) a practicing, baptized Christian. 	 Church Funerals are, under ordinary circumstances, provided for practicing Orthodox Christians who are current in their spiritual and material obligations to the parish; otherwise, the funeral service is conducted at the funeral home. The Church does not permit cremation. Parishioners in "good standing" are those Orthodox Christians who, as members of Saint John's Orthodox Church, strive to live according to the teachings of the Orthodox Church; participate in the life of the parish through regular church attendance, regular reception of Holy Communion and periodic Holy Confession (and receive these sacraments no less than once a year); if married, having been married in the Orthodox Church; and financially support the parish (especially through an annual "pledge"). Prospective members and returning members are asked to fill out an application form, copies of which are available in the church office.
