



SAINT NICHOLAS

On December 6, we remember St. Nicholas the Wonder -Worker of Myra. St. Nicholas is known for his deep faith and generosity. Because of this, he is beloved by Christians the world over. His holyday is also closely associated with the pre-Christmas season.

The Nativity Fast (Advent) Continues

As we journey towards our celebration of the Nativity, let us all focus more deliberately on our spiritual preparation for Christmas:

- Fast with a joyful heart. In addition to observing the regular weekly fast days of Wednesday and Friday, abstain from meat on additional days as you are able. *Christmas Eve is a strict fast day – no meat or dairy.*
- Pray every day. Use your prayer book. Open your Bible. Make sure you are offering the "Nativity Fast Prayer Challenge" from Metropolitan Gregory.
- Attend additional services. Over the first three weeks of December, we will have a Prayer Service (Moleben) for the Nativity Fast on Wednesdays at 6:00 PM and a Divine Liturgy on Fridays at 9:00 AM.
- CONFESSION is available before all morning services starting at 8:15 AM and before all evening services starting at 5:15 PM. Confessions end 10 minutes before the service start time. Remember: if the door to the "confessional" room is open and the light is on DON'T SIT IN THE FRONT PEW AND WAIT-WALK RIGHT IN. "Let every heart prepare Him room!"

 346-4457) when a family member is admitted to the hospital, or to request a home visit. Hospitals do not call to alert the parish when someone is admitted. Marriages are solemnized on Saturdays or Sundays. Circumstances may require a dispensation from the diocesan bishop. Consult the pastor at least six months in advance and before any plans have been made for the wedding reception. Marriages cannot be celebrated during the fasting seasons of the church, or on Fridays. Baptisms are usually scheduled on Saturdays or Sundays. Consult the pastor. Two godparents (godfather and godmother) are required, at least one of whom must be a practicing Orthodox Christian in good standing at an Orthodox parish, and the other (at least) a practicing, baptized Christian. 	 Church Funerals are, under ordinary circumstances, provided for practicing Orthodox Christians who are current in their spiritual and material obligations to the parish; otherwise, the funeral service is conducted at the funeral home. The Church does not permit cremation. Parishioners in "good standing" are those Orthodox Christians who, as members of Saint John's Orthodox Church, strive to live according to the teachings of the Orthodox Church; participate in the life of the parish through regular church attendance, regular reception of Holy Communion and periodic Holy Confession (and receive these sacraments no less than once a year); if married, having been married in the Orthodox Church; and financially support the parish (especially through an annual "pledge"). Prospective members and returning members are asked to fill out an application form, copies of which are available in the church office.
