Seasonal Christian Greeting

The greeting used in church for the period from the Nativity until Theophany is "Christ is born!" with the response "Glorify Him!"

Feasting and Fasting

The "12 Days of Christmas" are days of celebration! There is no fasting from Christmas Day through January 4th (*even on Wednesdays and Fridays*). January 5th—the eve of Theophany—is a strict fast day when no meat or dairy is eaten.

■ No Liturgy at Our Church on December 27

We will not have Divine Liturgy on the December 27 this year. Those who wish to attend services for the Third Day of the Nativity and St. Stephen the Protomartyr are invited to attend Divine Liturgy at Camp Nazareth on December 27, 2024 at 9:00 AM.

■ Theophany Services on January 5 & 6

This year, Theophany or Epiphany – the celebration of the Baptism of Christ – falls on a Monday. In order to maximize participation in the services for this great feast, we will observe the following schedule. On **Sunday**, **January 5**, **2025**, Divine Liturgy will be at 9:00 AM. At the conclusion of Liturgy, the Great Blessing of Water will take place. After this, "strict fast" refreshments will be provided by Fr. David and Pani Vikkie – all are welcome! After Coffee Hour, Vespers for Theophany will be served. On **Monday**, **January 6**, **2025**, Divine Liturgy for the holyday will take place at 9:00 AM. *Theophany is the third most important feast on the Church's calendar – don't miss it!*

■ House Blessings Begin January 6, 2025

Starting on the holyday of Theophany, Fr. David will be available to bless homes with the newly-sanctified water. As usual, house blessings will be *by request only*. An online form is available on our website <u>stjohnacroc.org</u>, and hard-copy forms are available in the hall for those who don't use computers. Fr. David will communicate with you directly to set up a day and time – he will not simply show up. *This is a wonderful tradition and a great way to begin the year with faith in Christ*!

Sacramental and Membership Information

Sick Calls can be made at any time. Please phone the rectory (724-346-4457) when a family member is admitted to the hospital, or to request a home visit to receive Confession and Communion. Hospitals do *not* call to alert the parish when someone is admitted.

Marriages are solemnized on Saturdays or Sundays. Circumstances may require a dispensation from the diocesan bishop. Consult the pastor at least six months in advance and before any plans have been made for the wedding reception. Marriages cannot be celebrated during the fasting seasons of the church, or on Fridays.

Baptisms are usually scheduled on Saturdays or Sundays. Consult the pastor. Two godparents (godfather and godmother) are required, at least one of whom must be a practicing Orthodox Christian in good standing at an Orthodox parish, and the other (at least) a practicing, baptized Christian.

Church Funerals are, under ordinary circumstances, provided for practicing Orthodox Christians who are current in their spiritual and material obligations to the parish; otherwise, the funeral service is conducted at the funeral home. <u>The Church does *not* permit cremation.</u>

Parishioners in "good standing" are those Orthodox Christians who, as members of Saint John's Orthodox Church, strive to live according to the teachings of the Orthodox Church; participate in the life of the parish through regular church attendance, regular reception of Holy Communion and periodic Holy Confession (and receive these sacraments no less than once a year); if married, having been married in the Orthodox Church; and financially support the parish (especially through an annual "pledge").

Prospective members and returning members are asked to fill out an application form, copies of which are available in the church office.
