ALL youth are invited to participate in the **Procession of Icons** at the conclusion of Liturgy on Sunday, March 9th – the Sunday of Orthodoxy. Icons will be provided, or they can bring an icon from home. This procession celebrates the "Triumph of Orthodoxy" and the restoration of icons after iconoclasm in the 9th century.

Read the Entire Book of Psalms This Lent: Make sure to take a copy of the 2025 Psalm Reading Guide from our Lenten Resource Table. It gives a portion of the Book of Psalms for each weekday of the Great Fast. This is a great (and very manageable) way to incorporate more Scripture in your Lenten efforts.

The first Lenten **Soul Saturday** will be marked with Liturgy on Saturday, March 15 at 9:00 AM. Envelopes to submit names (*hramoty*) are still available.

CONFESSION is available at the following times during Lent:

- Before Sunday Liturgy from 8:15-8:45 AM
- Before Wednesday Presanctified Liturgy from 5:10-5:40 PM
- Before Fridays Evening Services from 5:20-5:50 PM

You do not need to make an appointment or call ahead for these times. If you would like to schedule an appointment for Confession at a time other than those listed above, please call/text/e-mail Fr. David (724-813-3172, father.david@stjohnacroc.org).

Remember: Confessions are heard in the left side room (sacristy). If the door to the "confessional" side room is <u>open</u> and the light is on, please WALK IN!

Reminder About the Eucharistic Fast: Those receiving Communion at an evening Liturgy are to fast for a minimum of 3 hours prior to the service. (*Ideally, we should not eat after lunch.*) Fasting from midnight is still observed before receiving Communion at any morning Liturgy. (Remember: only services titled "Liturgy" have the distribution of Communion. Other services offered during Lent—Vespers, Canons, Molebens, Akathists, Paraklis, Parastas—do *not*.)

Lenten Pot-Luck Dinners: Following most Wednesday evening Presanctified Liturgies (*except March 5th and April 2nd*), we will have a pot-luck/covered dish meal in the Fellowship Hall. You are invited to bring a Lenten dish, baked good, or a beverage to share with those assembled. This is a great opportunity to gather mid-week and cheer one another on as we go through our Lenten journey as a community!

Easter Candy: We are grateful for all donations of candy for the annual Easter Egg Hunt on Pascha Sunday, April 20. Please leave candy in the hall. (We have plenty of plastic eggs as everyone was very generous last year, so we do not need any more plastic eggs.)

Pussy Willows: This year, we will be sourcing our pussy willows for Palm Sunday from the florist, to ensure that we will have enough for everyone. Because of this, we will not need any clippings from parishioners.

Sacramental and Membership Information

Sick Calls can be made at any time. Please phone the rectory (724-346-4457) when a family member is admitted to the hospital, or to request a home visit to receive Confession and Communion. Hospitals do *not* call to alert the parish when someone is admitted.

Marriages are solemnized on Saturdays or Sundays. Circumstances may require a dispensation from the diocesan bishop. Consult the pastor at least six months in advance and before any plans have been made for the wedding reception. Marriages cannot be celebrated during the fasting seasons of the church, or on Fridays.

Baptisms are usually scheduled on Saturdays or Sundays, but other days are possible as well. Consult the pastor. Two godparents (godfather and godmother) are required, at least one of whom must be a practicing Orthodox Christian in good standing at an Orthodox parish, and the other (at least) a practicing, baptized Christian.

Church Funerals are, under ordinary circumstances, provided for practicing Orthodox Christians who are current in their spiritual and material obligations to the parish; otherwise, the funeral service is conducted at the funeral home. The Church does not permit cremation.

Parishioners in "good standing" are those Orthodox Christians who, as members of Saint John's Orthodox Church, strive to live according to the teachings of the Orthodox Church; participate in the life of the parish through regular church attendance, regular reception of Holy Communion and periodic Holy Confession (and receive these sacraments no less than once a year); if married, having been married in the Orthodox Church; and financially support the parish (especially through an annual "pledge").

Prospective members and returning members are asked to fill out an application form, copies of which are available in the church office.
