ANNOUNCEMENTS

The Dormition Fast continues through August 14th. This two-week fast is in preparation for the Dormition of the Mother of God on August 15th. Fast as you are able, with a joyful heart. Additional weekday services are scheduled, in order to help us prepare to celebrate the Dormition.

Confessions will be heard 30 minutes before evening services; after services as needed; before Liturgy on Sundays (but no later than 8:45 AM); and by appointment.

August 14th: Calling All Young Ladies to be “Flower Girls”! At the end of Divine Liturgy on Sunday, August 14th—the eve of the Dormition of the Mother of God—there will be a short (indoor) procession to carry the “Shroud” icon of the Mother of God to the tomb arranged for the occasion. All girls of our parish are invited to walk in this procession and carry flowers (which will be provided). Parents, please let Fr. David know if your daughter(s) will participate.

Services for the Dormition of the Mother of God are as follows: Great Vespers is on Sunday, August 14 at 6:00 PM, and will include the blessing of loaves. Divine Liturgy is on Monday, August 15 at 9:00 AM, with the traditional blessing of **flowers and herbs**. Please bring some for this blessing and let them adorn your icons at home!

You might say, “But I JUST went to church! Why do I need to go AGAIN?” We Orthodox honor the Mother of God on many days throughout the year, but August 15th is her primary holyday. In many majority Orthodox and Catholic countries, August 15th is a national holiday, and people flock to churches and monasteries. Countless people travel to go on pilgrimages for this feast. We can make a special sacrifice to honor the Ever-Virgin Mary. So if you are able, come and celebrate the Mother of God at her “falling asleep” at one or both services!

Fr. David will be away August 21st through August 24th. In case of any emergencies in which the services of a priest are needed, please call Fr. Michael Gavrilos (4 1 2 - 5 0 0 - 2 2 6 2) or any of the local Orthodox priests.

August 28th: Sunday School Parents Meeting: After a hiatus, we will be resuming classes for our youth this fall. In order to plan accordingly for the coming school year, Fr. David wants to meet with all parents on Sunday, August 28th following Divine Liturgy. Part of this meeting will discuss coming up with a schedule for classes, and any other pertinent ideas. 

“Why do we bless flowers and herbs on Dormition?”

According to the church’s tradition, when the Mother of God died, she was buried in the Garden of Gethsemane. All the apostles were present, except for Thomas. Thomas arrived three days later and went to pay his respects to the ever-Virgin at her tomb. When the tomb was opened, it was empty – the Mother of God had been assumed into heaven. Within the tomb, there was a strong and beautiful aroma of flowers. To remember this, flowers and sweet-smelling herbs are blessed on this holyday. Historically, many of the herbs and flowers brought for this blessing were used in medicine, and thus the prayers ask that these plants be efficacious for the healing of body and soul.

Sacramental and Membership Information

Sick Calls can be made at any time. Please phone the rectory (724-346-4457) when a family member is admitted to the hospital, or to request a home visit. Hospitals do *not* call to alert the parish when someone is admitted.

Marriages are solemnized on Saturdays or Sundays. Circumstances may require a dispensation from the diocesan bishop. Consult the pastor at least six months in advance and before any plans have been made for the wedding reception. Marriages cannot be celebrated during the fasting seasons of the church, or on Fridays.

Baptisms are usually scheduled on Saturdays or Sundays. Consult the pastor. Two godparents (godfather and godmother) are required, at least one of whom must be a practicing Orthodox Christian in good standing at an Orthodox parish, and the other (at least) a practicing, baptized Christian.

Church Funerals are, under ordinary circumstances, provided for practicing Orthodox Christians who are current in their spiritual and material obligations to the parish; otherwise, the funeral service is conducted at the funeral home. The Church does *not* permit cremation.

Parishioners in "good standing" are those Orthodox Christians who, as members of Saint John's Orthodox Church, strive to live according to the teachings of the Orthodox Church; participate in the life of the parish through regular church attendance, regular reception of Holy Communion and periodic Holy Confession (and receive these sacraments no less than once a year); if married, having been married in the Orthodox Church; and financially support the parish (especially through an annual "pledge").

Prospective members and returning members are asked to fill out an application form, copies of which are available in the church office.
