Updates to Perpetual Commemorations of the Departed

Decades ago, our parish established a “*Perpetual Liturgy Fund*” to ensure that prayers would be offered for the departed loved ones of our parishioners. Today, this has grown to **125** separate intentions. While a daily Liturgy was something common in our Diocese in the early years, today it is no longer the norm.

Over the years, there have been two trends with these Perpetual Services in our parish: fewer and fewer families connected to these names are left, and more and more of our parishioners prefer to have them remembered on Sundays. During my pastorate, I have mostly satisfied both of these situations by offering one Panachida after the veneration of the Cross/Festal Anointing for any Perpetual Services that were not scheduled during the week. Starting during the 2020 shutdown and the period when we did not have coffee hour, I have served the Panachida before everyone was dismissed. However, the unintended consequence of all this is that many think that Panachidas are automatically scheduled every Sunday, or that a Panachida is a normal ending to a Sunday Liturgy!

Starting on **Sunday, January 15th, 2023** I will return to the “previous” order: Divine Liturgy, Announcements, Veneration of the Cross/Festal Anointing. I will generally *not* be offering a Panachida *before* the Veneration of the Cross/Festal Anointing on Sundays, excepting special occasions like Mother’s Day, Father’s Day, etc.

To streamline how **Perpetual Commemorations** are made, after some consideration, I will be applying the following practices starting

on **Sunday, January 15, 2023**. (*These apply only to the Perpetual Liturgy Fund intentions.*)

1. All Perpetual Commemorations for the Departed for a given week (Sunday through Saturday) will be mentioned in the context of the Sunday Divine Liturgy*. While we do not offer the “Litany for the Departed” on Sundays as on weekdays, I will find appropriate ways to publicly pray for these individuals on Sundays. I will also pray for them privately in the *proskomedia* (preparation of the bread and wine before Liturgy). *I will not be offering a Panachida on Sundays for Perpetual Commemorations.*

2. In order to continue to pray for the departed during the week, I will also include the Perpetual Commemorations for the week at a weekday service (*excepting Holy Week and Bright Week*).

3. If anyone would still like to have a separate weekday (i.e. Monday-Friday) service for a perpetual commemoration, I am open to scheduling this, provided someone will be in attendance in person. (Live-stream doesn’t count.)

Regarding “non-perpetual” memorial services, I will be outlining some things in a subsequent bulletin write-up!

May their memories be eternal!

Sacramental and Membership Information

Sick Calls can be made at any time. Please phone the rectory (724-346-4457) when a family member is admitted to the hospital, or to request a home visit. Hospitals do *not* call to alert the parish when someone is admitted.

Marriages are solemnized on Saturdays or Sundays. Circumstances may require a dispensation from the diocesan bishop. Consult the pastor at least six months in advance and before any plans have been made for the wedding reception. Marriages cannot be celebrated during the fasting seasons of the church, or on Fridays.

Baptisms are usually scheduled on Saturdays or Sundays. Consult the pastor. Two godparents (godfather and godmother) are required, at least one of whom must be a practicing Orthodox Christian in good standing at an Orthodox parish, and the other (at least) a practicing, baptized Christian.

Church Funerals are, under ordinary circumstances, provided for practicing Orthodox Christians who are current in their spiritual and material obligations to the parish; otherwise, the funeral service is conducted at the funeral home. The Church does *not* permit cremation.

Parishioners in “good standing” are those Orthodox Christians who, as members of Saint John's Orthodox Church, strive to live according to the teachings of the Orthodox Church; participate in the life of the parish through regular church attendance, regular reception of Holy Communion and periodic Holy Confession (and receive these sacraments no less than once a year); if married, having been married in the Orthodox Church; and financially support the parish (especially through an annual “pledge”).

Prospective members and returning members are asked to fill out an application form, copies of which are available in the church office.
