Our 2024 ANNUAL PARISH MEETING and Installation of the Church Board will take place on Sunday, January 28, 2024. All parishioners in good standing (which includes both reception of Confession and Communion no less than once a year, and financial support of the parish) are asked to attend. We look forward to your participation in this important meeting!

Upcoming Holyday: The Meeting of the Lord & Blessing of Candles

February 2nd is an important holyday known as the *Meeting of the Lord in the Temple*. Since it is the 40th day after Christmas, this feast commemorates the presentation of the infant Jesus into the Jerusalem Temple and His reception by the elder Simeon. This event is recorded in the Gospel of Luke 2:22-39. According to the Gospel, Simeon recognized the Child Jesus as "a light for revelation to the Gentiles." Thus the tradition developed of highlighting the use of candles on this day, as they remind us that Christ is the true Light of the World.

At the conclusion of the Divine Liturgy on February 2nd, we will offer the festal **Blessing of Candles**. We will have both decorated and plain candles available for a donation. You are also welcome to bring a candle from home for this blessing. Just place it on the prepared table before the Divine Liturgy. (If you are unable to attend Liturgy and would like to have a candle blessed, you can also bring it to Vespers the night before.)

KEEPING THE WEEKLY PRAYER LIST UP-TO-DATE

On Sundays and at some other services, we include prayers for the living during the Litany after the Gospel. In order to keep the prayer list relevant and current, Fr. David is going to try a new system. If you want someone to be included in our Sunday Prayer List, please fill out one of the newly-created cards and check off whether you want the person remembered for 1 WEEK, 1 MONTH, or 3 MONTHS. (After that period, you can always fill out a new card.) Cards can be given to Fr. David.

THOUGHTS ON STEWARDSHIP By Dan Hromyak

"Follow me and I will make you fishers of men." - Mark 1:17

Jesus' call to "follow me" is a call to all Christians! This call is in the here and now, in our present circumstances, not when we think we are "ready" or have everything in order. Good stewardship of our God-given gifts means that things aren't always going to go according to our schedule, but that God has a much better plan in store for each of us.

"Brothers and sisters: I should like you to be free of anxieties." - 1 Corinthians 7:32

How much anxiety do we bring upon ourselves by constantly worrying about not having enough or attaining more things? God won't necessarily give you everything you want, but He will provide everything you need. Try this - use the word "pray" instead of the word "worry" in the future. Then spend your time praying instead of worrying.

There is no doubt that all churches need money to keep the lights on, the water flowing, and for other operational expenses. Sacramental and Membership Information

Sick Calls can be made at any time. Please phone the rectory (724-346-4457) when a family member is admitted to the hospital, or to request a home visit. Hospitals do *not* call to alert the parish when someone is admitted.

Marriages are solemnized on Saturdays or Sundays. Circumstances may require a dispensation from the diocesan bishop. Consult the pastor at least six months in advance and before any plans have been made for the wedding reception. Marriages cannot be celebrated during the fasting seasons of the church, or on Fridays.

Baptisms are usually scheduled on Saturdays or Sundays. Consult the pastor. Two godparents (godfather and godmother) are required, at least one of whom must be a practicing Orthodox Christian in good standing at an Orthodox parish, and the other (at least) a practicing, baptized Christian. **Church Funerals** are, under ordinary circumstances, provided for practicing Orthodox Christians who are current in their spiritual and material obligations to the parish; otherwise, the funeral service is conducted at the funeral home. **The Church does** *not* **permit cremation.**

Parishioners in "good standing" are those Orthodox Christians who, as members of Saint John's Orthodox Church, strive to live according to the teachings of the Orthodox Church; participate in the life of the parish through regular church attendance, regular reception of Holy Communion and periodic Holy Confession (and receive these sacraments no less than once a year); if married, having been married in the Orthodox Church; and financially support the parish (especially through an annual "pledge").

Prospective members and returning members are asked to fill out an application form, copies of which are available in the church office.
