ANNOUNCEMENTS

Feasting and Fasting: Please remember that there is no fasting from Christmas Day through January 4th (even on Wednesdays and Fridays). January 5th—the eve of Theophany—is a strict fast day. No meat or dairy is to be eaten on January 5th.

Seasonal Christian Greeting: The greeting used in church for the period from the Nativity until Theophany is "**Christ is born!**" with the response "**Glorify Him!**"

Public Service Announcement – Don't Hoard Old Holy Water! As we celebrate the Blessing of Water, remember: while holy water doesn't have an "expiration date", replenish your supply yearly. Holy Water from the previous year should be poured outside (preferably onto the ground on a place where people don't ordinarily walk, along the foundation of your house, etc.).

House Blessings: Fr. David will be available to bless homes starting on January 8th. As usual, house blessings will be <u>by request only</u>. An online form is available on our website, and hard-copy forms are available in the hall. Fr. David will communicate with you directly to set up a day and time—he will not simply show up!

THEOPHANY 2024

January 6th is Theophany or Epiphany—the Baptism of Christ. Many do not realize that this is the third most important holyday after Easter and Pentecost! This year, our schedule of Theophany services and events is as follows:



- Friday, January 5th—Theophany Eve: We will have our evening Vespers Service at 6:00 PM. Following the service, we will gather for a community "Holy Supper" with many of the traditional foods and customs. *Please sign up if you plan to attend so we can plan accordingly! All are welcome!*
- Saturday, January 6th: Divine Liturgy will be at 9:00 AM. The Great Sanctification of Water will take place at the end of Liturgy. Make EVERY EFFORT to attend Liturgy on this great feast, especially because it is a Saturday! The Blessing of Water is an incredibly beautiful and spiritually-enriching rite of our Orthodox Church.

Christmas and Theophany are like two "bookends" of the same feast. The Church wants us to continue to celebrate what Christ has done for us and our salvation. Please plan on participating in these services and events!
